- Boopsie

Boopsie is an app that allows you to access your library card from your smart phone. Just download the Find It VA app, select Caroline Library, and you are ready to go. With this app, you can search our catalog, put books on hold, renew books, and much more.

- Computer Help

- eBooks

eBooks are a great way to travel

Assistance is available with Math, Science, Writing, Reading and SAT Prep. This service is accessible after school in the library

Access to Homework Help is available through our website carolinelibrary.org. When you enter Literati/Homework Help, you will have to select a library to log into the system. You will see a tab labeled Homework Help click on this tab and enter the information requested. Once you have

finished this you will be assigned a teacher and taken to a Whiteboard session to receive the help needed. Homework Help is available. During the school year: Mon. - Thurs. 3pm - 9pm Saturdays 9am - 3pm Holidays: Not available on major holidays

From November 5th—17th the library will be accepting the following list of items for fines and fees.

Wet Dog or Cat Food
Can of cat/dog food = \$1.50

Dry Food
3-5 lb bag = \$7.00
10 -15 lb. bag = \$15
Over 25 lb. bag = \$25

Cat Litter
2-5 lb bag = \$5
10 lb. bag or bigger = \$10

Miscellaneous
Towels = \$5 per NEW towel

All items received must be unopened and not expired.

Towels must be newly purchased, we will not accept used towels.

Help us provide for those animals waiting for adoption at the shelter. All items collected will be given to the Caroline County Animal Shelter.

The top 10 challenged books last year were:

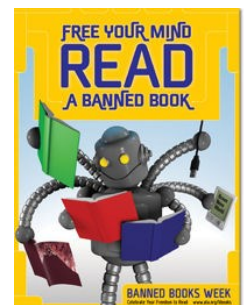
1. This One Summer written by Mariko Tamaki and illustrated by Jillian Tamaki

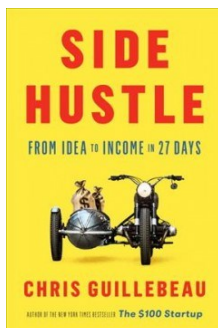

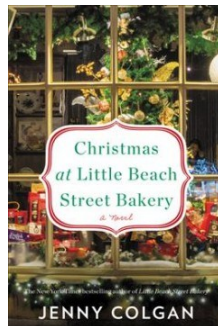
