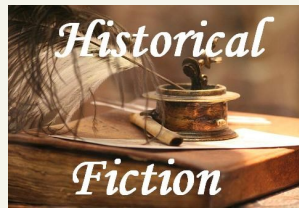

Are you enjoying the Genre of the Month Club? Spring is here and we are delving deeper into the Library's collection.



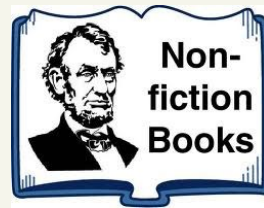
March

If you are stumped for a good read, we are here to help!

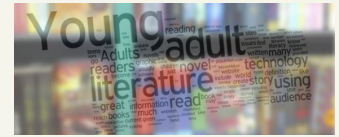

**Celebrate Preservation Week at Caroline Library!**

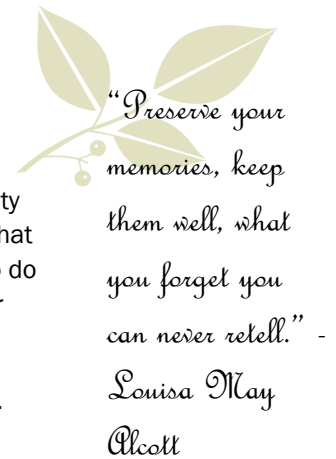

The Caroline Library is accepting nominations for one volunteer position, from each of the counties voting districts, for the Library's Board of Directors.

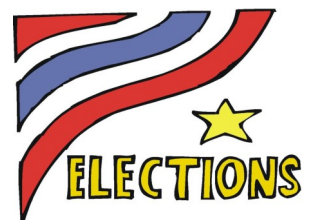
Qualifications

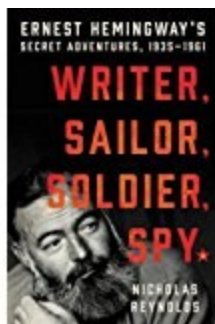
