### VIRGINIA'S FORGOTTEN CANNERIES

Are you looking for something to do over the holidays? Why not take a trip to the Library of Virginia.

Tuesday, August 1 - Saturday, December 30, 2017 Place: Second Floor Reading Rooms Free

Created by the Blue Ridge Institute of Ferrum College, Virginia's Forgotten Canneries documents the home canning industry developed by local farmers that supplied vegetables and fruits to the commonwealth's increasingly urban population for more than 50 years. These rural canneries were small operations that also provided cash wages for rural residents. Counties along Virginia's central Blue Ridge Mountains were particularly rich in canneries, such as Botetourt

County, which was home to 193 of them in 1915. The exhibition features colorful and eye-catching labels—on graphic panels as well as on a pyramid of actual cans—many of which were created by the Piedmont Label Company (now Smyth Companies), of Bedford, which donated approximately 10,000 of its pre-1960 labels to the Blue Ridge Institute in 2014.

### AARP TAX PREPARATION

Starting in February, AARP will again this year be preparing taxes for FREE at our Bowling Green, Dawn, and Ladysmith branches. This service is available for anyone regardless of age and/or income.

Please bring the following things to your appointment.

- •All year-end tax statements
- Last year's tax return

- •Driver's license or other form of government-issued photo ID
- Social security card for yourself and each family member
- •If you purchased health insurance through the Marketplace under the Affordable Care Act, your 1095A form. However, even if you didn't buy insurance through the Marketplace, you may receive a 1095B or 1095C. You should

bring that as well.

- If you bought or sold your home, bring your final closing papers
- •If you think you might itemize your expenses, bring information summarizing your medical expenses, property and real estate taxes, interest paid on a home mortgage, charitable donations, and miscellaneous deductions.
- •If you plan to have your re-

fund or amount due paid directly to/from your bank account, you will need to have your bank's routing number and your account number. For checking accounts, this can usually be found at the bottom of the check.

Please note tax preparers will not be available everyday at each of the branches. Therefore it is important to call ahead and make an appointment.


