Celebrate 50 years Since Landing on the Moon

At 9:32am EDT on July 16, 1969, Apollo 11 astronauts Neil Armstrong, Buzz Aldrin, and Michael Collins were launched on their journey to the moon.

After traveling in space for 3 days Apollo 11 reached the moon. The astronauts orbited the moon for a day and on July 20, 1969 Armstrong and Aldrin took lunar module Eagle to the surface of the moon.

The lunar module landed on

the moon at 4:18pm EDT and astronaut Armstrong radioed **Houston, "Houston, Tranquility Base here. The Eagle has landed."**

Armstrong stepped onto the surface of the moon at 10:56pm EDT on July 20th **with the words, "That's one small step for man, one giant step for mankind." Upon stepping on the moon Aldrin offered the simple yet powerful description of the lunar surface, "magnificent desolation".**

The two explored the moon for 2½hours, collecting samples and taking photos. They left behind an American flag, a patch honoring the fallen Apollo 1 crew, and a plaque **on one of the Eagle's legs. The plaque reads, "Here men from the planet Earth first set foot upon the moon. July 1969 A.D. We came in peace for all mankind."**

Explore Out of This World Books All Summer with the Ladysmith Book Club!

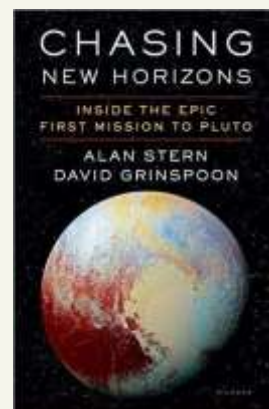

Online World War I Poster Collection Library of Virginia

The Library of Virginia's Prints and Photographs collection houses more than 240,000 prints, photographs, postcards, posters and ephemera. Over the years, we have digitized not only parts of our own collections, but also some very interesting local photograph collections housed at public libraries across the commonwealth. As with all of our digital collections, the digital photograph collections are searchable by

keyword, creator, and title. Our older digital photographs are managed in our online catalog, and all can be searched simultaneously.

World War I Poster Collection

When the United States entered World War I in 1917, a means of communication was needed to encourage the public to support the war. The Division of Pictorial Publicity

enlisted some of the era's finest artists, including Charles Dana Gibson, Howard Chandler Christy, James Montgomery Flagg, Haskell Coffin, and Joseph Christian Leyendecker, to design bold graphic posters to help spread the word. The Library of Virginia's Prints & Photographs Collection includes among its holdings a collection of 44 original World War I posters. Topics illustrated in the collection include

enlistment in the armed forces, Liberty Loans and Bonds, and industrial mobilization.

How to Prevent the Summer Slide and Give your Child a Head Start in the Fall

Did you know that children who **don't read during the summer** can lose up to two months of learning by the time they return to school in the fall? However, children who participate in Summer Reading Programs and read a minimum of six books over the summer score higher in reading AND math when they return to school.

The Children's Literacy Initiative has 5 tips for preventing the summer slide:

Choose the Right Books

You want to find books that are challenging but also engaging.

Set Goals

Engage your child when setting reading goals. Will it be an amount of time each day or a

book a week.

Make it Fun!

Take a book to the park. Play games or do puzzles that require reading. For younger children sing songs or recite nursery rhymes.

Go to the Library

The library has FREE programs to engage your child. While you

are there why not let your child pick out some new books.

Read Everyday

Practice makes perfect, and reading is no exception.

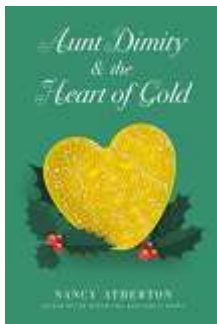

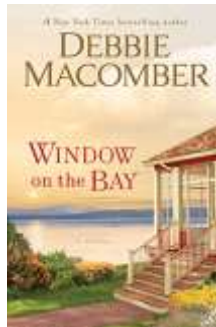
